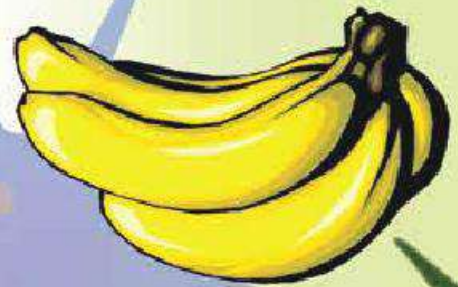
Ahmed decided to go to Cock's birthday party. He called Cock and said, "I am coming to your birthday party."

"Should I get bananas? I can eat the fruit, and the camel can eat the peel. But then Cock won't get anything," he thought.

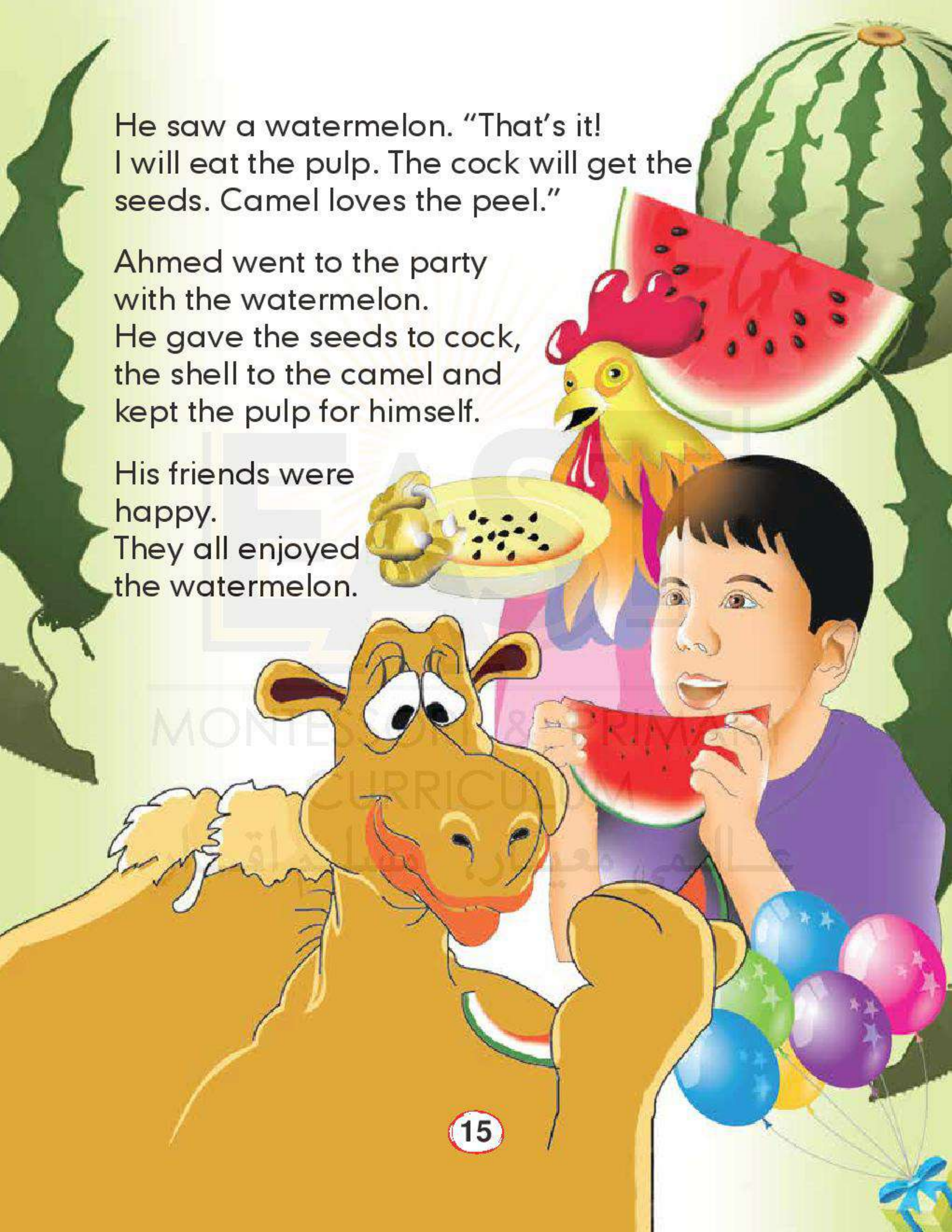
At a dry fruits shop, he saw almonds. "They would be enough for Cock and me, but camel won't get enough."

Discuss with children the central message, characters, overall structure including the beginning and ending of the lesson, and then ask them to do the following exercises.

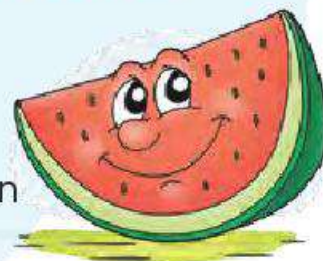
